

Trainer's top tips: SAGE Video

Our Trainers have put together their top tips for using the **SAGE Video** platform, an online platform containing hundreds of educational and research-orientated videos organised into eleven subject collections. To learn more about this database, **explore more of our training resources**, and speak to your library staff who will be happy to help you!

Make sure you have full access to what you want to view

Different institutions have access to different video collections on the **SAGE Video** platform. If you do not have access to particular videos through your institution's subscription, you will see a purple padlock icon on the video:

Check with library staff to discover which subject video collections your institution subscribes to.

Create a free profile to save searches, add videos to lists, and create video clips

By <u>creating a free profile</u>, you will be able to save searches, add videos to lists to refer to later, and create customised video clips.

Save a search: On the search results page, click the **Save Search** button at the top left of your search results. Give your search a title and click **Save.**

Save a video to a list: On the video page, click the icon at the top of the video transcript called **Add to list**. Choose the list you'd like to add the video to, or create a brand-new list.

Create video clips: On the video page, click on Create Clip underneath the video. Use the sliders that appear on the video to select the start and end times of your desired clip. Click on Save to my clips (a list just for clips) or Save to my list. Choose the list you'd like to add the video clip to, or create a brand-new list. Video clips are a great way of personalising your content to use in your own teaching or learning!

You can access your **saved searches**, and your **saved lists (and video clips)** by clicking on your name at the top-right of the page, and then **View my profile**.

Browse by discipline to start exploring our video collections

From the <u>SAGE Video</u> homepage, use the browse by **Discipline** headings in your chosen subject area. This will open up a list of sub-topics within a discipline, and allow you to discover videos that are focused on your teaching and learning aims.

Look out for functionality to use videos according to your needs

On each video page, there are a set of icons at the bottom of the video transcript. **Cite** will generate a reference for the video in four referencing styles, and allow you to export the reference into a number of different reference managers. **Share** allows you to pass on the details of the video to a friend, student or colleague. **Embed** will generate a HTML code which you can copy and paste into your Virtual Learning Environment (VLE) or Learning Management System (LMS) so that students can watch the video without going to the **SAGE Video** platform.
